
























O Batallion aid stations (48)



- Tented and conainerized Role 1+ Medical Support (active reserve, 24 pers + 2 MD)
- Emergency Medical Care in field conditions
 - Advanced Trauma Life Support ATLS[®]
 - Advanced Cardiac Life Support ACLS[®]
- Capacity: 10 (trauma) resuscitations and 50 temporary emergency patients / 24 h







Hospital Bataillons + Medical Logistics Bataillon

- 4x Hospital Bataillons (active reserve)
 - 200 beds capacity each
 - Low level care (nursing care, emergency department, minor surgery incl DCS, high care with ventilator beds)


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
- Run underground Military Hospitals (2)
- Run combined civ-mil underground Hospitals (7)
- Subsidiary modular medical support to other civilian Hospitals
- · 2x Hospital Bataillons (reserve)
 - only personnel
- 1x Medical Logistics Bataillon (active reserve / reserve)
 - Supporting production sites of Armed Forces Pharmacy




Challenge: High readiness of Armed Forces for Support to Civilian Population (from 2016)

- Pharmaceutical production and Medical logistics (immediate)
- Special Operations Medics / Docs (hours)
- 1 Role 1+ (6/12 hours)
- 5 Medical companies (each 6 Role 1+) (24 hours)
- 4 Hospital batallions (24 hours)








	Current Challenges in healthcare issues:
۶	Budget Cuts : - on the military and civilian side - military : - 1960-ies, 2.5 % of GDP - 2009 reduced to 0.8 of GDP
۶	Medical personnel shortfalls in military and civilian institutions
>	shortfall of 30'000 nurses in 2020 Migration of medical personnel about 50 % foreign doctors at the universities
>	Feminization of medical profession current ratio at the university female vs male 70/30 %

Challenge: How to motivate draftee medical students



• **Key asset** for the Medical Services of the Armed Forces, always drawn between very demanding clinical work and obligation to serve

- Incentive for study beginners: intensive training in emergency medicine (PHTLS[®]) and leadership before studies start; top motivator!
- Service free period during studies
- **Practical year** with 8 weeks medical officers course on ACLS[®], ATLS[®] and on call duties: added value for future clinical work advantage against other students!

Result: 80 – 100 Military Medical Doctors / y Forces Coordinated Medical Services, SQ, MA Advances Stetabaner MD 26
